

2018 Impacts



240 volunteers traveled to Haiti with CCH and another 60 people volunteered in the U.S. All told, these 300 volunteers spent over 16,000 hours working in concert with CCH's 33 staff members (including 7 new staff who joined in 2018). CCH piloted a successful new type of "Come and Serve" volunteer trip, open for anyone to join. 13 team members on the inaugural trip helped staff CCH school and PT clinics in addition to providing other technical expertise.



In November, 2018, CCH welcomed our first surgical team to the Jim Wilmot Surgical Center at our new facility. Staff and volunteers are all enjoying the natural light from windows in the new space! Thanks to the October container shipment with ophthalmology surgery equipment, 15 patients received eye surgery - a first at CCH. For one week in August, one of CCH's ORs turned into a dental suite, providing 227 dental procedures to 136 patients (children and adults). Our referral list continues to grow, thanks to partnerships with nearly 30 referring partner clinics across Haiti.

Preventative care remains a vital outreach to the community. In 2018, CCH hosted 25 health education seminars, serving more than 1,000 people. Information shared about high blood pressure, stroke, breast health, and cervical cancer will undoubtedly save future lives. 85 girls participated in "Days for Girls" reproductive health classes and received menstrual hygiene kits with reusable supplies. Thanks to partners, Dr. Laura Dabinett and Winchester Medical Center, CCH provided 350 pap tests for early detection of cervical cancer, the #1 cancer killer of Haitian women. At risk women identified from the pap tests received follow up GYN consultations and surgical procedures, as necessary.





CCH's 3 rural partner schools with student sponsorship programs achieved a 94% student retention rate between 2017 and 2018. Education program staff undertook a deeper analysis of the complex factors affecting matriculation rates at our partner schools, which will lead to improvements in future education programming. A total of 447 students benefited from the sponsorship program, receiving tuition support for schools, teacher training, parent engagement seminars, hot lunches, Kreyol books, and classroom supplies. 12 new picnic tables were built by volunteers and students at 2 partner schools - adding extra space for outdoor classes, lunch, and community meetings.

13 community leaders and 4 CCH staff members formed the first cohort of CCH's "Training the Trainers" Leadership Development Program. These 17 men and women met 3 times in 2018. They agreed upon key values, like transparency and compassion. and identified training topics needed to increase leadership skills. The cohort participated in planning sessions and training seminars on written and verbal communication and conflict resolution.
