I was also able to sell two goats to pay for my children's school tuition and medical expenses. Today I have four goats—and one is pregnant! In Orangé, we take care of each other, and CCH helps us do that with goats and other programs.

Our cohort of community leaders tells us what topics they want to learn more about and CCH Community Development staff put together training seminars on the most requested topics. So far in 2025, CCH has hosted 4 training seminars on the importance of local community organizing, how to assess program effectiveness using metrics, and how to identify and integrate new leaders into community groups. According to CCH Community Development Liaison (staff), Nazaire Leveillé, "The leaders testified that this kind of training will help them a lot in improving their leadership skills in the communities."

CCH also hosted a tool and seedling distribution event on Agriculture/Labor Day in Haiti. Tools like pickaxes and machetes were given to farming co-ops, which then lend them out to farmers one at a time for maximum community benefit.
