Thank you for your continuing support of the Community Coalition for Haiti. As we have communicated over the past several months, the challenges in Haiti persist and, in some cases, have worsened. **Your generosity has enabled CCH to persevere through these challenges and to continue our work in Haiti.**

Unfortunately, our financial situation is becoming increasingly challenging (more on that below), but through the incredible dedication of our Haitian staff, CCH continues to provide high quality medical care, education training, and

community development support impacting tens of thousands of Haitians around Jacmel, Haiti.

The challenges CCH faces in Haiti are known by many of you. Armed gangs now control over 90% of the capital, Port-au-Prince, including the roads connecting Port-au-Prince to outlying areas. More than 1.3 million Haitians have been displaced from their homes. Many have fled to the Jacmel area, resulting in the CCH clinics and our partner schools becoming

overcrowded and strained. The Haitian government remains almost completely dysfunctional, and the entire country continues to be enveloped in a dark environment of fear, insecurity and distrust. Our Haitian staff suffers along with their fellow citizens.

We cannot cut our budget further without scaling back vital programs like clinic hours or school lunches. **We need your donation today** to fund critical services through year-end.

**Through it all, CCH's critical ministries have pressed on.** After a brief period of staff changes, our Primary Care Clinic (PCC) is fully staffed again, and we are

seeing more patients than at any time in our history. Indeed, the PCC will see over 13,000 patient visits in 2025. Our Rehabilitation Clinic is also seeing more patients than at any time in our history, likely exceeding 15,000 patient visits in 2025. What is especially exciting for our Rehab Clinic is that we recently shipped much-needed equipment to Haiti—including 4 treadmills, 3 exercise bikes, and 2 hand bikes—enabling us to triple the number of patients we will be able to serve over the course of a year. For many Haitians, the only option for good medical care in Jacmel is the CCH clinic, and many prefer our clinic due to the quality of care and the dignity of personal interaction that our outstanding staff provide.

Last year, I reported that we have provided in-depth training for four of our School Directors (Principals), and these Directors have essentially replaced the teams of US teachers that we used to send to Haiti to provide Professional Development for Haitian teachers. We currently are supporting eleven partner schools, and additional schools frequently request our support. **Your financial support has enabled all of this**—as well as the provision of a hot, nutritious lunch for more than 650 students every school day and part-time school nurses at three rural schools.

Unfortunately, we have been forced to reduce the number of training sessions for the teachers due to our financial constraints.

Our community development team continues to oversee sustainable projects we have implemented to help the long-term health of eight partner communities, as well as to teach and run school garden programs at three partner schools. These projects include goat projects, beekeeping, and building latrines. CCH also hosts training sessions for community leaders to help support concepts critical to the success of the projects, such as leadership, teamwork, and collaborative communications. Regrettably, we have had to postpone reinforcing several community development projects because of the financial strain.

**Please join us in continuing to pray** for the nation of Haiti—for a return to healthy government functioning, for a reduction in violence and the restoration of the rule of law, and for the physical and emotional health of CCH's

Haitian staff, their families, and their communities. **We believe that God is in control, and we frequently see glimmers of hope.**

Earlier, I mentioned our financial challenges and that the cost of everything continues to increase. We don't want to reduce our supply of medicines, but our expenses have more than doubled over the past several years. The cost of food for the school meals has also doubled just since 2023, while the number of students has ballooned thus requiring more food. Maintaining our clinics and program center, hiring school nurses and our new Occupational Therapist—EVERYTHING costs more.

Since July 1, 2025, we've cut an additional \$86,000 from our already spare 2025 budget. This means we are providing no new teacher training sessions, no new community latrines, and no new goats. There is simply nothing left to cut without restricting the services we provide to our clinic patients, school students, and community partners.

**As the end of 2025 approaches, please consider responding to our upcoming Giving Tuesday or Year End campaigns with a generous gift.** CCH needs to raise an additional \$350,000 by year end in order to keep operations functioning at current levels. Perhaps now is the time for you to give more than ever before to help sustain CCH and our vital ministries in Haiti. These final months of the year are critical for CCH to meet our budget as we prepare and plan for 2026 and to help meet the ever-increasing needs for healthcare, education, and community development for the people and communities we serve. **And if you are able, please give now to help us bridge the gap to year-end giving.**



