Letter from the Executive Director

Hello and happy new year from CCH! As a new year begins, I appreciate reflecting on the past year. It is important to name both the hurdles and the bright spots and to express gratitude for all God has done to further our mission in and around Jacmel, Haiti.

Most hurdles are consistent—the transporting of goods to Haiti; the political instability, gang violence, and mass inflation impacting our Haitian brothers and sisters; and the struggle to raise the funds needed to support our critical work. But the bright spots far outshine the hurdles!

Last year, in January 2025, we launched our vaccination program. After years of planning, we received final approval to move forward. It was a fantastic year administering nearly 1,400 important vaccinations. I'm so thankful for this partnership with MSPP (Haiti's Ministry of Health).

Also early in the year, our partners at MST & Associates donated a considerable amount of gently used equipment for our PT/OT Rehab Clinic. In July, we sent down treadmills, exercise bikes, hand bikes, mini staircases, dumbbells, and more. Those items have invigorated our rehab staff and transformed clinic operations, as you'll see in the 2025 rehab consultation stats.

I wish I could share more about last year's mental health program, the new secondary septic tank, our wonderful in-country partnerships, the cost savings provided by the new solar batteries installed in late 2024, and so many more bright spots.

In closing, I am tremendously grateful for each donor, volunteer, supporter, and member of our Coalition—YOU! Your generosity of spirit, of time, and of your financial resources allowed us to end the year ready to take on 2026.

We look forward to all the ways that, together, we'll be able to love and care for our Haitian brothers and sisters this year. And we look forward to your continued partnership!

CCH operates a Primary Care Clinic, a PT/OT Rehab Clinic, and a pharmacy. We provide school nurses 3 days per week at 3 rural schools, so that the nurses can treat sick children, teach health lessons, and be a resource to parents. Our school nurses also provide free wellness checks and vaccinations throughout the school year. Our healthcare services are provided at low or no cost with sliding scale fees so that healthcare is accessible to ALL.

Patient visits continued to increase in 2025, totaling 28,624! This is an approx. 10% increase from our already record-breaking 2024 consultation totals. We also started offering vaccines at our Primary Care Clinic and partner schools through a partnership with the Haitian Ministry of Health (MSPP).

Our Rehab Clinic received a much-needed boost in capacity thanks to donated equipment that was shipped to Haiti in March and July. CCH also continued to expand our capacity partnerships with other health organizations. One issue we're addressing through partnership is mental health. Haitians face tremendous challenges as a result of year after year of terrifying gang violence, disruptions to daily life, natural disasters, and generational poverty.



CCH PRIMARY CARE CLINIC PATIENT **Silienne**

A few months ago, a young mother named Silienne carried her two sick children up the steps to the CCH Primary Care Clinic in Jacmel. For more than two weeks, her children had grown sicker. And Silienne endured headaches, stomach pain, and a heart that raced from stress and fear. She had nowhere else left to turn.

At the top of those stairs, she met Dr. Rachelle Frézin. Dr. Frézin examined each child with the careful attention every mother hopes for. She diagnosed 2-year old Joana with malnutrition and ringworm, she treated 5-year-old Maximo for a urinary infection, and she cared for Silienne, too, addressing her tachycardia and epigastric pain.

Silienne was terrified about the cost of healthcare. The rising cost of living had already pushed her to the edge. But at CCH, every test, every medicine, and every follow-up visit was covered because of our caring donors.

CCH partners with 11 primary schools around Jacmel, Haiti, to provide a variety of resources in support of higher quality education. This year, our education ministry adopted a new model of professional development that included 8 "Train the Trainers" sessions via Zoom led by CCH education team volunteers.

Student enrollment at our 3 main partner schools **increased by 30% in 2025**. We're pleased that families are finding refuge in Jacmel from other parts of Haiti. However, it's hard to keep up with the demand for our school programs (like hot lunches).



Emmanuella is a 12-year old student in 6th grade at EMEVO Primary School. She has one brother and two sisters in her family. She loves the school garden program and it has helped her at home. Here's what Emmanuella told us... *"It allows me to have the skills to help my parents at home at our farm. Last year, not only were we able to grow our own vegetables at home but we also sold some tomatoes in the public market of Jacmel. With the money we earned, we were able to buy new shoes for the school year."*



CCH PARTNER SCHOOL TEACHER **Sanora Ferraut**



Like many new teachers in Haiti, Ms. Ferraut stepped into her first grade classroom with deep commitment but with very little formal training. She chose to teach at Lavanneau Primary School because it is her home. These are her neighbors' children; she wants to contribute to her community's future.

"When I was a kid we didn't do much art in school, but other teachers at a CCH training were recommending it. I can see how much the kids love it. I use art to awaken their curiosity. It helps them understand faster. And it helps them imagine what they can create on their own."

Peter (right) is a 53-years-young father and strong community leader in the area of Demontreuil. He has been attending CCH's leadership training sessions for years and has been instrumental in starting two key programs for his community: microfinance and family gardens. *"Not only does the community recognize Peter as a good farming advisor, but they also recognize him as a servant leader,"* says Nazaire Leveillé (left), CCH staffer.

Peter's goal right now is to raise up more young leaders with good manners and farming skills to become the next generation of caring neighbors in Demontreuil. *"I would also love to get more seeds and farming tools to continue boosting our family garden program,"* says Peter. Peter reminds us that real change in Haiti doesn't come from quick fixes—it comes from people who quietly show up for their neighbors every day.

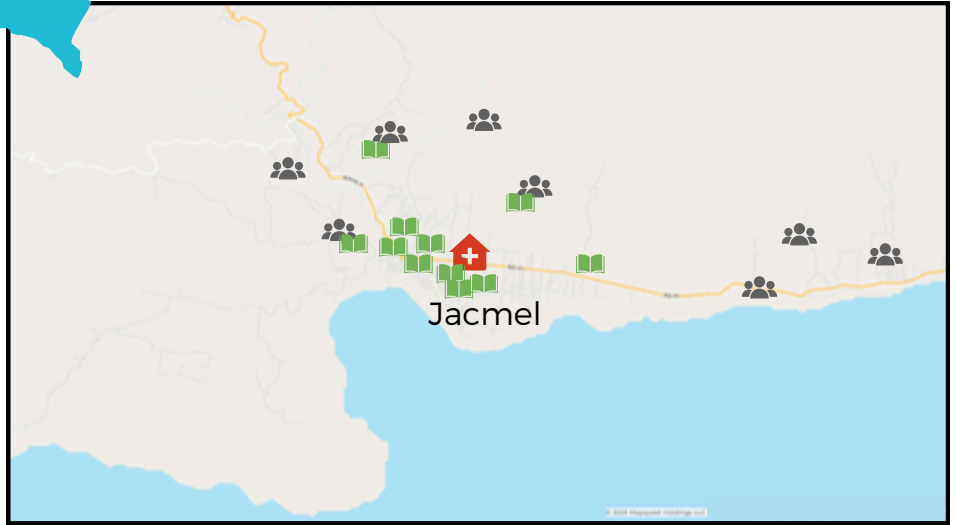
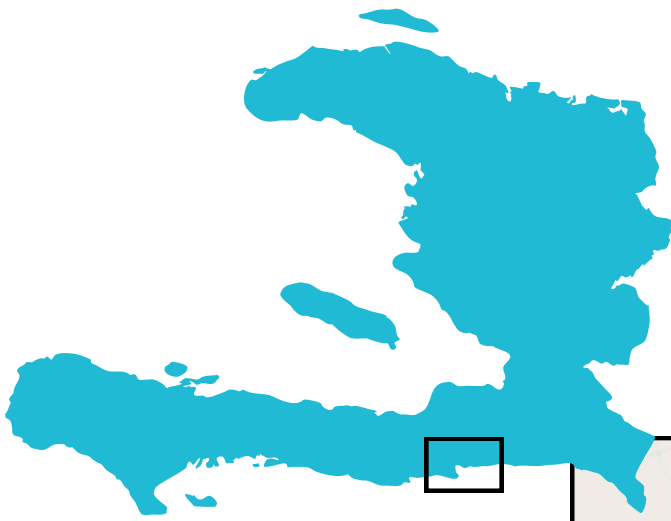

We also gather community leaders together for training seminars on farming best practices, project development and sustainability, and how to communicate effectively to improve program success. Community leaders feel supported by each other and CCH with the tools they need to meet life's challenges.

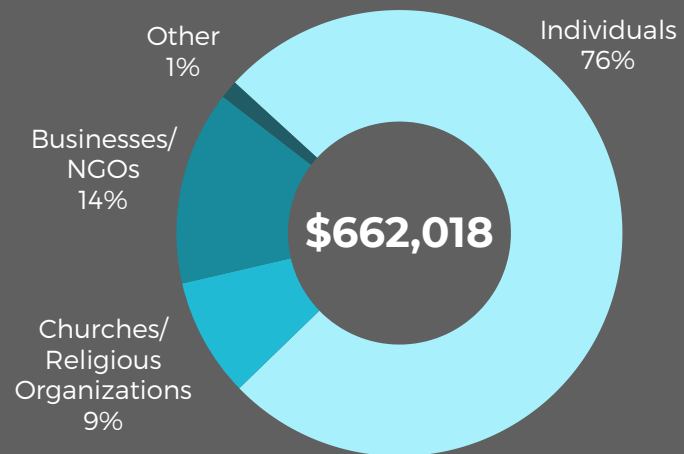

- **28,624** patient consultations at CCH’s Primary Care and PT/OT Rehab Clinics (combined)
- **> 30** pieces of new PT/OT equipment added to CCH’s Rehab Clinic to help us care for more patients
- **120,000** meals fed to primary school students
- **\$15,000** in generator fuel cost savings thanks to new solar power battery bank
- **90** families received food assistance, and **60** farmers received starter plants and fertilizer to aid in Hurricane Melissa recovery
- **1,398** vaccinations administered to patients
